**CME is reserved for company principals, owners, and upper management and must be approved by the company owner. CME is achieved by successfully completing ten day long classes and documenting at least five years of experience. CME candidates must reaffirm their pledge to abide by the NCMCA "Standards of Conduct." ## CERTIFICATION

### TO CERTIFY OR TO NOT CERTIFY?

Why should you get your employees certified?

- Are you interested in bidding certified specs?
- Do you want to appear more professional to contractors?

In addition to increasing the professionalism of masonry contractors, the program is also targeted for specification writers, architects, and owners as a means to pre-qualify masonry contractor firms for building projects.

NCMCA has proceeded with an ambitious program to market certification for use in specification documents and as a means of insuring quality masonry installation performed by the documented top professionals in the industry.

NCMCA provides two levels of certification for individuals. Contractor firm foremen, superintendents, project managers, and middle management can become “Certified Masonry Professionals” (CMP) by completing a minimum of eight daylong classes and documenting five years of experience in the masonry and/or construction field. Company principals, owners, and upper management can become “Certified Masonry Executives” (CME) by successfully completing ten daylong classes and documenting at least five years of experience. We will be offering Modules 9 & 10 on September 17 & 18 at Triangle Brick in Durham.

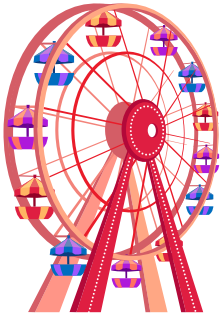


## NC STATE FAIR CONTEST IN OCTOBER

# Eastern Randolph High School "Wildcat Masonry Program" By David Albright

My program is geared and focused on allowing my students to see and understand how the construction industry works and centralizing on the true integrity of Masonry. The students here at Eastern first learn and understand the importance of masonry and how much it affects their everyday lives from the house they live in, to the school and buildings they walk through every day. I myself graduated from Eastern Randolph in 2003 and learned masonry in my very same shop with my favorite instructor, Mr. Darrell Carmac. I started my Masonry Career with McGee Brothers and went from there to work with other masonry contractors and for myself for several years. But the most important thing here are my "Wildcat" Masonry Students. My students and I have done a few community projects and mostly built and upgraded areas on our campus here at school. We always practice our projects in our shop before we build them so the students can get confident in their abilities so when "it's time for the rubber to meet the road" if you know what I mean, they understand the process from the first spread of a bed joint to the crisp tooling of joints on a rowlock. My students have built our "Lady Cats" softball field brick backstop and dugouts. We also pulled up the old worn-out fence work on the baseball field and re-designed our backstop with a beautiful Monticello Modular brick donated by McGee Brothers. We dug and poured new footers, and the students learned the great importance of having a good solid, level, and workable concrete footer with nominal step-ups to lay brick on. From teaching them how to use the Laser transit, plumbing/setting corner poles, to marking off our scale 6, the students tying a line block reminded me how I've enjoyed showing a young'un how to tie their shoes for the first time. Boy was that fun, and of course they were over thinking it again. The baseball field's beautiful brick back stop has been done for a while and has lots of good memories of willing hands on it. We have demoed our old wooded FFA organic vegetable planter with split faced blocks donated by Old Castle. A regular 8" CMU didn't seem so heavy after the students got to man handle some good Ol' Split Face blocks. Our latest build around the campus was the taking up some good Ol' "Sanford and Son" rusted fence work at the Football field and we replaced it with brick columns and fence rails. The students learned really quick that columns can grow a belly on them before you know it. They definitely learned the importance of a good tight line and the plumb bubble was their best friend. McGee Brothers saved the day again and helped us out with some good smooth red common brick to match the masonry work around the gym and stadium. We capped off our columns with a "Sleepy Hollow" Solid 3" Portland Cement and Terrazzo Cap. Schneider Stone out of Asheboro, NC stepped up and donated the caps for the columns. The students cut and polished these caps themselves using hand grinders and diamond polish pads. Boy, I have some tough students for sure. My students have surely learned that hands on in the shop, trying hard at competitions, and building things around campus is definitely "where it's at" these days when it comes to them getting the full experience next to walking on the jobsite for the first day on a masonry job. I can truly say...I love my job, I love my students, and I love what God has blessed me with each and every day. Each day with them is an adventure for sure, but the positive environment we create for them is what they need and love. The daily smiles and the "I appreciate you Albright" keeps me so happy with the passion to teach. I'm proud to say ... "I'm a Wildcat"!
